





CoR members

CoR bodies

- debates by the CoP;
- final event: 9th CoR Summit/Plenary on 3-4 March 2022 in Marseille

CoR communication

- cooperation with EU institutions, EDICs and associations;



Follow-up: What does the European Commission suggest?

European Commission Communication of 17 June 2022 (extract)

- Dedicating time and resources to organise citizens' panels with the aim to deep-dive into a select number of key themes and help prepare particularly important sets of key initiatives and receive feedback from ahead of launch of legislative process;
- Organising smaller targeted deliberative or co-creation/co-design processes, run in a smaller scale, to address specific policy issues more cost-effectively and in a timelier way;
- Help to build capacity amongst national, regional and local actors to launch a new generation of decentralised citizens' dialogues based on deliberative approaches;
- Develop a European Charter for Citizens' Participation targeted at all those who participate
 in or organise citizen engagement activities promoting the general principles that are
 essential for successful citizen engagement;

What will the CoR do?

- Conference on how to link the levels of democracy on 27 June together with the Bertelsmann Foundation
- Resolution to be adopted and debate with Guy Verhofstadt on 29
 June during the Plenary
- Capacity-building and networking: engaging with cities, regions, European associations and the EU institutions (as of September 2022)
