Under the headline “Europe’s regions and cities: Partners for investment and growth”, the OPEN DAYS 2015 will be a forum for national and regional managing authorities, final beneficiaries and EU institutions to exchange information and facilitate networking on new approaches for implementing the European Structural and Investment Funds. 150 workshops and debates await around 6 000 participants in Brussels from 12 to 15 October 2015. Some 700 speakers will take part in the debates.

## Regions, EU institutions and policy-making: a free online course

Between 19 October and 11 December 2015, the CoR will offer the first-ever online course or MOOC on “Regions, EU institutions and policy-making”. The objective is to create a learning platform on EU affairs and their impact on local policies to officials working for regions and cities as well as students and others interested. Each course week is dedicated to one theme, which is presented through interviews and debates with about 50 politicians, experts and academics from all over the EU, which will be completed by factsheets and infographics. Participants are invited to post their questions and discuss once a week live with experts in Brussels via web-streamed meetings and can receive a statement of participation provided they have completed 80% of the course.
