2. Purpose and description of the personal data processing

Purpose(s) of the personal data processing

The purpose of the processing is gathering information for preparing the study (cdr.19644). This study (based on the questionnaire) aims to collect information, including personal data, so to establish a report on the European Youth Work Agenda and to provide an overview of the challenges regarding the implementation of the Agenda and the Bonn Process from the perspective of the local and regional authorities, to suggest ways to mitigate the challenges identified during the process (how these could be tackled) and to make concrete proposals and recommendations on how the local/regional level would become more involved in the Agenda and the Bonn Process.

Personal data will be collected in order to contact you for participating to the online questionnaire (via EU survey) and for giving your contribution to it. The questionnaire is part of the study commissioned by the CoR to the processor 'Fondazione FORMIT'. This questionnaire is made available online by invitation only. Invited organisations and individuals will be sent a personal link to the questionnaire by email.
