DATA PROTECTION NOTICE

European Public Communication Conference (EuroPCom)

1. Introduction

The *European Committee of the Regions* (hereafter "CoR") is committed to respecting and protecting your personal data in accordance with [Regulation \(EU\) 2018/1725](#).

The *European Public Communication Conference* (hereafter "EuroPCom") is an annual conference and networking event for communication experts from local, regional, national and European authorities, as well as private communication agencies, NGOs and academia.

EuroPCom takes place online and on-site in Brussels (hybrid mode). The EuroPCom community is invited to register for the event on the dedicated website <https://cor.europa.eu/en/plenaries-events/flagship-events/europcom>. The registration is open the months before the event (exact dates are announced on event's site), for both onsite and online participation.

2. Who is responsible for the processing of personal data?

The EuroPCom, is organised by the CoR in close cooperation with the European Commission, the European Parliament, the Council of the European Union, the Club of Venice, the European Investment Bank, the European Economic and Social Committee, the European Central Bank, the Vrije Universiteit Brussel and the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development.

The CoR is in charge of the general management, coordination and program of the event; the participant registration system; the videoconferencing/recording/broadcast management; the interpretation; the managing of media/journalists; the institutional communication activities; implementing surveys before/during/after the event; the assessment and reporting.

The CoR (as controller) is responsible for the collection and processing of your personal data. The delegated controller, specifically Unit D2 – Events and Local Dialogues, is the service within the CoR tasked with carrying out these processing activities (contact details: europcom@cor.europa.eu).

Personal data is processed on behalf of the controller by a data processor acting under the controller's authority and bound by contractual and legal safeguards.

3. What is the purpose of the processing?

Your personal data will be processed in order to:

- Register you to the EuroPCom annual edition'.
- Perform the selection of participants/attendees and the link to the corresponding category of participants for specific organisational and administrative reasons such as: facilitators, speakers, moderators, journalists, communication and other experts, MEPs, MPs, CoR Members, CoR Staff, YEPs, EU Councillors, influencers, researchers, etc.;
- Provide you access to the venue, accordingly to the current accreditation system for visiting the CoR and EP premises;
- Provide you online access to the conference;
- Grant you access to various hosted, newly presented communication, conference and engagement tools, some of them in pilot mode (with your consent only);
- Provide you useful guidelines/instructions on this particular event;
- Coordinate, manage and execute the event;
- Share your first and last name (and the nickname you choose for yourself when accessing the meeting platform) with the other participants by participating online to the event;
- Evaluate questionnaires during the registration process and surveys sent out before, during and after the event (with your consent only);
- Analyse participants' opinions and statements (voluntarily given), about their experience related to the event, to improve CoR reachout capacity;
- Present speakers and moderators (contributors to the event), by using their CVs and photos on the event website and to promote the event on social media and any other media channels.
- Send you invitations to future events that CoR may organise (with your consent only);

Special Data Protection Notices (DPNs) apply for digital tools, some AI-powered, that might be used during EuroPCom's meetings, as well for Security and IT enforced measures (e.g. accreditation, video surveillance, etc.). Please check our special-per-case DPNs at [CoR's Data protection webpage](#).

During the event, participants may be invited to voluntarily test or interact with third-party communication, engagement, or conferencing tools. These tools are offered outside the scope of the event's data processing operations and are not managed or controlled by the event organisers. If you choose to use such tools, please be aware that your personal data will be processed under the responsibility of the respective third-party service providers, in accordance with their own privacy policies. We strongly encourage you to read and understand the privacy notice of each tool before participating. Links to the relevant policies are available via the event registration platform.

EuroPCom sessions may be subject to live web streaming, audio and video recording, and photography (both on-site and through screen captures during online participation). These recordings may include:

- Speakers and participants, and
- Group photographs of participants and organizers.

Such materials may be published on institutional websites, social media platforms, and other communication channels for purposes related to event promotion, documentation, and transparency. Note that it is possible (as described below) to express the wish not to appear in pictures and/or videos by getting a "NO PHOTO" badge at the reception on the day of the event and to wear that badge during the whole duration of the event.

The CoR is not responsible for recordings, such as videos and photos (recorded, screen-captured, etc.) made by participants in their private capacity.

4. What is the legal basis for the processing?

The legal basis for the processing of your personal data collected for the organisation and management of this EuroPCom by the CoR is Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, in accordance with which the processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in a Union institution or body. The CoR exercises its tasks as set out in Articles 300 and 305-307 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union.

The processing of your personal data, that is not falling under the above mentioned legal bases, will be carried out based on your consent (Article 5(1)(d) of [Regulation \(EU\) 2018/1725](#)).

5. What personal data are processed?

The following personal data will be processed:

- Information necessary for your registration and your participation in the event (including selection, categorization, access to online sessions, etc.):
First name, last name, email address, age group (given by date of birth), country of origin, name of organisation, type of company/institution/organisation, function, gender, session attendance, choice for physical or on-line attendance.
- Information necessary for access to the conference venue (in case of not possessing an EU official badge), the following personal data will be processed:
First name, last name, email address, nationality, date of birth, identity document (ID) type, ID number, ID expiry date, name of company/institution/organisation, specific assistance requirements (if any).
- Information necessary for implementing the event:
Photos, audio and videos taken during the event (recordings and webstreaming), including if you are speaking during the conference.
- Information useful for event's purposes (with your consent), by participating in answering to surveys and/or in activities presenting/using new communication, conference and engagement tools:
First name; last name; email address; country; gender; age group (given by date of birth); type of company/institution/organisation; function.
- Additionally in case you are a speaker or a moderator (contributor to the event):
photo, title, short biography (CV) provided by you, social media identifier if applicable, video and audio when you are speaking during the conference, photos and videos taken during the conference.

Your consent is requested for:

- Including you in attendees list containing your name and affiliation, which will be shared among participants;
- Receiving invitations to future events the CoR may organise;
- Participating in activities of EuroPCom, presenting and/or using new communication, conference and engagement tools, hosted by the event and governed by third party *Privacy Policies*;
- Participating to voluntary surveys related to this and other CoR events and accepting the collection (and thus the processing) of this information to improve this and other CoR events, as well as for research purposes.

If you have expressed the wish not to appear in pictures and/or videos, we would therefore ask you to get a "NO PHOTO" badge at the reception on the day of the event and to wear that badge during the whole duration of the event.

Please remember that without the NO PHOTO badge, the photographer will not be aware of your wish not to have your photos taken and/or not to appear in videos and therefore your image might appear in the [name of event] pictures and/or videos

6. **Who are the recipients or categories of recipients of your personal data?**

The recipients of your data will be:

- CoR staff in charge of coordinating, organising, managing and following-up this event;
- EP staff in charge of giving access to EP for sessions that will be held in EP;
- CoR's contractors' staff, operating under the orders of CoR staff;
- Other European research Institutions, for research purposes, working only on data received by CoR after they have been anonymized (not personal data anymore);

Under certain conditions defined by law, we may disclose your information to third parties (such as the European Anti-Fraud Office, the Court of Auditors or law enforcement authorities) if it is necessary and proportionate for lawful, specific purposes.

We will never share your personal data for direct marketing purposes.

Photographs (recorded or screen-captured) and/or audio and video recordings could be published in the context of the EuroPCom and in the framework of CoR activities on the web, including via social media. If necessary, the files containing the video materials may be slightly altered (for example, brightness and contrast).

Live streaming, video recordings, and photography may take place during EuroPCom sessions. This includes recordings and screen captures of speakers and participants, as well as group photographs of attendees and organisers. These materials may be published during or after the event in the context of EuroPCom's communication and promotional activities.

We use third-party social media platforms (Facebook, X [formerly Twitter], LinkedIn, Instagram, and YouTube) to promote EuroPCom and share information about the event. Please note that when interacting with our content on these platforms, your personal data may be processed according to the terms and conditions of the respective platforms, which

operate under their own privacy policies. We are not responsible for the availability or functioning of these external services, nor for how they process personal data. We recommend that users consult the privacy policies of each platform to understand how their data may be collected, used, and how they can exercise their rights: [Facebook](#), [X](#), [LinkedIn](#), [Instagram](#) and [YouTube](#)

If you have any concerns or questions about these communication providers' use of your personal data, you should read their privacy policies carefully before using them.

Our social media moderation policy

The Committee of the Regions is present on social media to communicate about its work and better engage with the public. We are present on Facebook, LinkedIn, Instagram, and YouTube and we encourage you to share our content and take part in our discussions. Please note the accounts we follow are not an indication of our endorsement.

The CoR social media accounts are managed by the CoR social media team in unit D3 and are monitored daily to the greatest possible extent, but not on a 24-hour basis.

We are happy to see different views and opinions on our social media accounts, however we ask you to observe a fundamental principle of good behaviour. Please show respect to fellow users and avoid inflammatory, insulting or offensive language. We reserve the right to not respond to, hide or delete all the comments that are defamatory, racist, spam, repetitive, irrelevant and/or commercial. Users that post violent, threatening or clearly illegal content will be blocked. We encourage you to post comments that stick to the subject and contribute to the ongoing debates.

During EuroPCom sessions, participants may be invited to engage with new communication, conference, or interactive tools presented as part of pilot activities. These tools are provided by third parties and are not covered by this Data Protection Notice. Participation in these tools is entirely optional. We recommend that participants consult the relevant privacy notices and policies to understand how their personal data may be collected, processed, and used.

7. Are your personal data transferred to a third country or international organisation?

Your personal data are not transferred to non-EU member states or to international organisations, apart the communication by Internet and social media.

8. How can you exercise your rights?

You have the right to access your personal data, to rectify any inaccurate or incomplete personal data, to restrict (under certain conditions) the processing of your personal data, to request the deletion of your personal data (if processed unlawfully) and, where applicable, the right to data portability.

You have the right to object to the processing of your data on grounds relating to your particular situation, at any time.

You also have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. Please note that the withdrawal of consent will not have retroactive effect.

You can direct your queries to the responsible service (delegated controller) for processing your personal data, CoR/Directory D/-Unit D2-Events and Local Dialogues, at europcom@cor.europa.eu. Your query will be dealt without undue delay and in any event within one month of the receipt of the request. That period may be extended by two further months where necessary.

You have the right to lodge a complaint with the European Data Protection Supervisor by using the [contact form](#) if you consider that your rights under Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 have been infringed as a result of the processing of your personal data by the CoR.

9. How long are your personal data kept for?

Your data (excluding photos, audio and video recordings that have been published,) will be kept for a maximum of 12 months after the end of the event.

Contributors' names, photos, audio and video recordings, from the conference, will remain in that format indefinitely or until there is a specific request from the person concerned to have his or her personal data deleted.

10. Are the personal data collected used for automated decision-making, including profiling?

The CoR will not use your personal data to make automated decisions about you. "Automated decisions" are defined as decisions made without human intervention.

11. Will your personal data be further processed for a purpose other than that for which data have been obtained?

Your personal data will not be further processed for a different purpose.
