1. Your job and responsibilities

Interested in the automotive industry and contributing to its future through the work of the Committee of the Regions (CoR) and the Automotive Regions Alliance (ARA)? Want to be involved in the monitoring and development of just transition and transport policy?

As a team member in the Unit C1 - COTER, you will be responsible for leading the COTER Commission's work on the ARA, coordinating with stakeholders in view of establishing work planning and ensure its smooth running. You will provide analytical and policy support to CoR members, manage studies as relevant, and represent the COTER secretariat at working level on the topic of the automotive industry. Linked to this workstream, you will also be involved in COTER's work on just transition and transport.

You will organise meetings, seminars and conferences on the topic of the automotive industry, together with an assistant. You will liaise with hosting region(s)/area(s), prepare the programme and supervise practical arrangements.

You will also be responsible for supporting members in the preparation of CoR opinions and resolutions; identifying, monitoring and reporting on the progress of dossiers in the inter-

institutional and wider context; drafting speeches, briefings, letters, and other documents; and providing information for data requests related to COTER's work.

You will be part of the dynamic team of the COTER Commission secretariat, which consists of 15 colleagues.

2. Who are we? What are the challenges for us ahead?

Our Unit COTER commission secretariat has a staff of 15 colleagues - a Head of unit, deputy Head of unit, nine policy officers, three assistants and a trainee, and is part of the Directorate C Legislative Work 2.

Our field? Our Unit is in charge of organising the work of the COTER Commission, assisting its members in drawing up the CoR's opinions, supporting the political process within the Bureau and plenary sessions and organising commission meetings and external events. The COTER commission deals with the EU budget, cohesion policy, territorial cohesion, transport policy, just transition, urban policy, and regional statistics and indicators. We manage the work of two well-established external Alliances – the Automotive Regions Alliance (ARA) and the Cohesion Alliance - and we coordinate internal work on the Multi-annual Financial Framework and on housing. We have responsibility for the official EU register of European Groupings of Territorial Cooperation (EGTC) and for managing the European Cross-Border Platform (ECBP), as well as the CoR's work on Territorial Impact Assessments (TIA).

Our main achievements Over recent years, the COTER commission has established very good relations with the European Parliament and its REGI, TRAN and BUDG committees, the European Commission, the Council presidencies, as well as with other relevant institutions and organisations. Thanks to both our legislative work and alliance-building activities, we have achieved political and operational impacts in the policy areas under our remits.

Our challenges ahead are closely linked to the current state and future outlook of the European Union. Since 2024 a key focus of our work has been the preparation of the 2028-2034 Multi-annual Financial Framework (MFF) and in ensuring a strong role for local and regional authorities in its design and implementation across all policy areas. Multi-level governance, partnership and territorially-sensitive policy design and implementation are essential for the EU to deliver in all places for all people. However, significant work remains to be done in view of bringing EU and national stakeholders on board in this respect.
